HOLY EUCHARIST REV. H. SANDERS LAY READER - DON KIEFER Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ,

Awhile back I read a "Monday Matters" column by the Rev. Jay Sidebotham of Renewal Works. He spoke on trust, or rather the lack of trust we see today in so many places. People that no longer trust our political leaders, or who don't trust city government, or who don't trust our taxes to help our lives run smoothly. Even people who no longer trust religious institutions. He sees the Episcopal church as having a "healing vocation," as people often come to us from places where they have been hurt or left out.

Our lives are full of cases where people we love and trust have let us down. Fr. Sidebotham wrote about how that did not even bypass our Lord Jesus Christ in his time on earth. Just look at the Gospel stories which are full of people who turned from Christ when they did not understand. In the end, Christ faced the betrayal of Judas, the denial of Peter, and even the desertion of his disciples. So Jesus definitely knows our pains as He faced them, too.

Fr. Sidebotham went on to explain that trust is very closely related to love. "We are called to trust in God, to trust that the final word is love, that the meaning in the universe is love, that even when it makes no sense, we were designed to show, share, and receive love. When we hear the call to love God, it's in many ways a call to trust God."

In Psalm 18, the psalmist reminds us that God is our rock, our refuge, our stronghold. Fr. Sidebotham reminds us that it "takes faith to practice that kind of trust."

He speaks to the heart of the matter in his summary. "When the church proves to be just a collection of faulty human beings, when those in our closest circle hurt us, when our own resources fall short, Psalm 61:2 calls on us to 'trust the one who will not falter, to set our feet on a rock that is higher than we are." He quotes the desert father Abba Poeman who said, "Do not give your heart to that which will not satisfy your heart." Trust in the Lord, knowing His love never fails and He will be with us as we face all that our lives hold for us.

As we go through our daily lives, hearing so much and facing so much, Fr. Sidebotham urges us to remember and be led by the call of our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry these past nine years -- "If it is not about Love, it is not about God."

Danny Meyer writes in his book <u>Setting the Table</u> about the human drive to provide and receive hospitality. He said, "Within moments of being born, most babies find themselves receiving the first four gifts of life: eye contact, a smile, a hug, and some food. It isn't much of a surprise that we will crave those gifts for the rest of our lives." May we give those gifts to those who cross our paths as well as those who don't, as we trust God and give the love He has freely given us back out into the world around us. We are the hands and feet of Christ in this world.

On August 12,, St. Paul's was honored to hold the memorial service for our Priest of 20 years, the Rev. Rolf Leed, who retired in 2016. The Eucharist was celebrated by Bishop Diane Bruce. Her loving presence meant much to all of us. Father Leed was our "full time" part-time Priest as well as a full-time counselor with the Pathways Behavior Center where he touched the lives of many people in his years there. He was also on call 24/7 for the jail whenever a prisoner needed spiritual or emotional help. We were all blessed to have known him.
