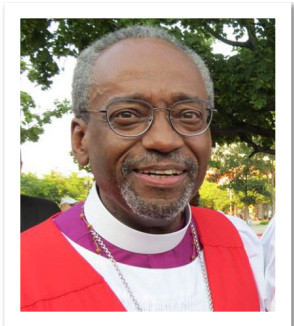
CROSSLEY ALTAR LINENS DEDICATION

PRESIDING BISHOP ELECTED

The Episcopal Church's General Convention made history June 27 when it chose Diocese of North Carolina Bishop Michael Curry to be its 27th presiding bishop. Curry, 62, was elected by the House of Bishops from a slate of four nominees on the first ballot. Curry's election was confirmed an hour later by the House of Deputies, as outlined in the church's canons, by a vote of 800 to 12. He will serve a nine-year term that officially begins Nov. 1. On that date, Curry

will succeed current Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori and he will become the first person of color to hold that position. "It really is a blessing and privilege to serve our church and to serve our Lord in this way," he said. "I treasure this church, this house, the House of Bishops, all of us. "This is a good and wonderful church and we are good and wonderful people and I thank God to be one of the baptized among you," Curry said, adding, "My heart is really full."
