Sam French, who is our representative on the Ministerial Alliance, reports that they have set up an emergency number for people to call when there is a need for help. The number is: 660-351-0598.

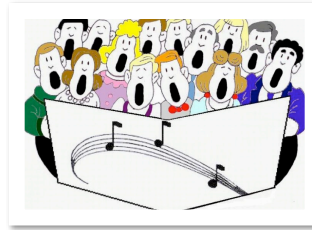
## **DEANERY MEETING IN OCTOBER**
