

A Message from the Bishop's Warden

Dear Friends in Christ,

Do you know I have orchids? And the orchids manage to do well despite the fact that I do not have a green thumb.



Years ago, I noticed how well they did in the new spot I had moved them to because of our Christmas tree placement, and we had to rearrange the living room to make sure they kept that prized bit of sunlight. Poor Sam had to get used to another position for his chair. He still

brings that up from time to time. Just ask him Every now and then my orchids "speak" to me. Once during the Pandemic, when the churches were closed and everything seemed like it would never be the same, an unexpected spike on an orchid I really thought would never bloom again gave me hope that life as we knew it would return.

I had another such experience just recently. If you look closely, you will see a new spike on the pictured plant. Well, a couple of weeks ago when we heard the parable about the fig tree, this poor orchid "spoke" to me. You will see how it desperately needs to be repositioned.

We need to remember that God is always with us, though everything in our lives, and we don't need to let ourselves be swallowed by fear and desperation. Jesus walks beside us every step of the way, loving us and supporting us and helping us through all situations. I thank God that He always loves me and is always there to nourish and care for me in whatever way my soul needs. May I always respond to that love and continue to grow in His love.
