A Message from the Bishop's Warden

Dear Friends in Christ,

This month I am going to share a reflection from d365, a short meditation I use to begin my morning. It has a scripture and then a reflection.



Galatians 5:1, 13-14:

"Christ has set us free for freedom. Therefore, stand firm and don't submit to the bondage of slavery again. You were called to freedom, brothers and sisters: only don't let this freedom be an opportunity to indulge your selfish impulses, but serve each other through love. All the Law has been fulfilled in a single statement: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Reflection by Pastor Wilfredo Mercado Reyes of the Baptist Churches of Puerto Rico:

"It feels good to say, "I'm free!" when I've taken an exam I've been preparing for, or when I've completed that paper I worked so hard to finish. I am thrilled and even try to reward myself. We all love to be free from what oppresses us. I find it curious that most of the time when we use the word 'oppression,' we associate it with something that victimizes us. I recognize that procrastination may be the main factor in my feeling oppressed. When I choose to procrastinate and not prepare diligently, stress

stress makes me feel like its servant. That uncomfortable feeling seems to be the culprit, but I'm the one who decided to put myself in that situation.

"Paul affirms in Galatians that our freedom come from Christ. He also emphasized that we are called to be free, avoiding giving power to our way of doing or reacting. He exhorts us to avoid forms of life that, although they appear to be freedom, end up enslaving us. Let us always remember that Jesus came to set captives free."

In Romans 7:15, St. Paul talks about his internal struggle: "I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do." We can all identify with what St. Paul says. We all fall into our habits or desires from which we wish to be free and feel enslaved to, and we all fall short of living into Christ's words as we wish we could.

So the passage from Galatians spoke to me. Especially its last line: "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love of ourselves and others, Christ's command, leads us to where we need to be.

I hope this reflection speaks to you in some way, also.
